I'm sorry to be slow in responding, but as I mentioned, we've had an extremely busy and successful past two weeks, launching NutriStudents K-12 in Pennsylvania and Alabama.

It was good talking with you last week regarding KidsPeace Mesabi Academy's foodservice. Thanks for sending the specific section of the USDA Healthy Meals publication we discussed.

As you know, that USDA directive guides state agencies in selecting nutrient analysis software they use to verify USDA compliance of menus offered by schools they audit. State agencies are required to use one of these programs when conducting an Administrative Review/audit.

While not required, many FSDs also use one of these software programs when developing their menus. In fact, NutriStudents K-12 uses NutriKids nutrient analysis software to validate compliance of our chef-created menus to federal guidelines.

This highlights the fact that NutriStudents K-12 is not a nutrient analysis or menu planning software. We are a web-based service providing more than 100 weeks of certified menus as well as training resources and simplified purchasing. Our menus are all ready to go with as little menu planning as you'd like. We've already used our nutrient analysis software to confirm weekly totals for components, sodium, calories, etc., for you. Schools following NutriStudents K-12 menus (which are certified by our Registered Dietitian as being 100% compliant) can be absolutely certain of complete compliance with all USDA nutritional requirements, whether or not they use any nutrient analysis software. NutriStudents K-12 alone is all you need to meet the federal nutritional guidelines.

Because we use a nutrient analysis software and provide food production reports, verification reports, HHFKA checklists and other supporting documentation to our clients for their compliance audits, nearly all forego licensing nutrient analysis software. We've done the work for them. About 42 of our client schools successfully passed MDE audits the last two years, most relying the menus and reports we provide.
